He died in 1943 during WW11, The CWGC Certificate has his name as Edward
Lambert Bramhall, Parents Randle and Edith Bramhall, with research it is confirmed
that he is Edward Limbert Bramhall

Edith Bramhall Wife aged 31 Yrs , Married 7 Yrs 3 Children born and 3 children still
living, She was born in Frodsham, Cheshire

Edward Limbert Bramhall, son, aged 3 Yrs born Rochdale Lancashire

George Bentley Bramhall, son,aged under 8 Mths Born Rochdale Lancashire

Note

It is stated they had 3 children but only 2 on this census

1911 census district Castleton No 2 Rochdale Marland

Randle Bramhall Patient aged 7 Yrs Born Urmston Lancashire

This will be their other child so he was a patient at Marland Hospital when 1911
census was taken

His birth was registered

Randle James Bramhall district Barton I Vol 8c page 736

And according to GRO(General Register Office) his mothers Maiden Name was
Limbert

Edwards Parents were Randle Bramhall and Edith Limbert they had married in 1903
at Runcorn Register Office or Registrar attended

Edward L Bramhall had 2 brothers

James R Bramhall b 1904 and George Bentley Bramhall b 1911

Randle Bramhall b 22 nd Jan 1874 Marr Cotton Mill Manager

Edith Bramhall b 25th Dec 1879 Marr Unpaid Domestic Duties

James R Bramhall b 3rd Feb 1904 Single Chief Gas Works ?

George B Bramhall b 12th Jan 1911 single Draughtsman ?

Note

Edward L Bramhall is not on this 1939 register and cannot be found on 1939 Register
Possibility that he was already in Merchant Navy

Edward's Aunt Edith Bentley Bramhall was Married to Henry Ap Ellis Williams in 1896 at Parish Church of Harpurhey(this would have Christ Church)

Edward's Uncle Ernest Married Ellen E Bardsley in 1900 at Preston Register Office

Edward's Uncle Frederick James Bramhall was Married to Fanny Margaret McClymont in 1904 at Albert Memorial Church Manchester

Edward **Limbort** Bramhall Official No –NAP/R 105733- Diesel Greaser-H M S Dasher – DOB 3/5/1907-POB Rochdale Lancs- DOD 26/3/1943 COD No 2 POD At Sea

Edward Lambert (Limbert) Bramhall served as Navy Auxillary Personnel with the Merchant navy on H M S Dasher as Diesel Greaser

He died on 27th March 1943 when his ship went down in Firth of Clyde due to an explosion

There were 528 crew of which only 149 survived

Details were published in Shetland time(article in his folder in St Aidan's Church for viewing on Heritage open days and Remembrance Sundays and by Appt

There seems to be a difference in document as to DOD some state 26/3/1943 some state 27/3/1943

Edward Limbert Bramhall is commemorated at Liverpool Naval Memorial
And on War Memorial at St Aidan's Church Sudden Rochdale
