#### From the Vicarage: a reflection for the Fourth Sunday after Trinity

Today we focus on God's protection from ourselves and God's protection from the evil one. The collect for today reminds us that God is the protector of all who put their trust in him. Trusting God when we know we have failed, even as Saint Paul said, we knew that we wanted to succeed but our body, our human nature, failed us. And so without God nothing is strong, nothing is Holy; we are on our way through this world, yes things "temporal" to another world, of things that will be eternal, so we continue hour by hour for help in this world and on this journey of faith.

Paul reminds us in his letter of how we are stuck in the ways of the world, we have to live with them, as we are human. How we have, as a human example, corrupted our town and cities and countryside with pollution and environmental needs. We have tried and continue to try to be good even when we know we will fail, and this distresses us. But the redemption, which Christ has brought, is for our bodies as well as our souls. We have now the first fruits of the gift of the Holy Spirit and we should labour even to make ourselves and this world a better and beautiful place. The Gospel reminds us that there are two ways to judge others: worldly and heavenly. But God alone is judge of all.

So judge not. Well it's hard not to judge others, almost impossible day by day, but we mustn't. So we must therefore leave the judgement to God, rather look towards ourselves, and be of charity. As we could end up like the man who spends all his time offering to pull the speck out of his friend's eye and found he had no close friends because he had a log hanging out of his own eye and all walked away. Therefore be of charity to others, for we have great need that others will be kind and loving and charitable to us. Amen.

News from the Diocese: Archdeacon / Assistant Archdeacon Appointments

Following the appointment of the former Archdeacon of Rochdale, the Ven Cherry Vann, as Bishop of Monmouth in November 2019, the new Archdeaconry arrangements will formally come into effect from 1 July 2020. The Ven David Sharples has been appointed Archdeacon of Rochdale. 2020-2021 will be a year of transition and change for the diocese as we deal with the issues presented by the pandemic and our underlying financial challenges. In order to provide additional capacity during this period, the Revd Canon Karen Smeeton will continue as Assistant Archdeacon of Rochdale until 31 May 2021.

## News from the Vicar & Churchwardens on the church reopening

The refurbishment project is due for completion this week and all arrangements should be in place to allow the church to be open on **Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> July at 10am**. It is intended to hold a weekly service on Sundays with no Wednesday service for the time being. Contact details will need to be recorded and a one-way system will be in operation. A restricted amount of people will be allowed in church and 2m distancing will be observed inside and queuing outside. The service will last about 30 minutes with no singing and unfortunately there will be no children's area or resources available. Please note that exit will be by the West Door and there will be no access to the Hall, including the toilet facilities.
