From the Vicarage: a reflection for the Fifth Sunday after Trinity

In the gospel reading this week we discover that God is planting people. Although in one way the seed is the word of the kingdom, in this passage the seeds are mainly seen as people. The seed is the 'person' who is sown. Seed sown on rocky ground is the person who hears but what does he or she do about it? Likewise, for seed sown among thorns; this is the person who only hears the word. But as for the one sown in good soil, this is the person who hears the word, and does.

But again, the promise is not of surroundings that are all sweetness and light, of prosperity, of peaceful worship of God. Here the only favourable conditions may be internal not external.

All that Jesus saw around him was a land full of corruption, overwork for the poor and the rich getting richer, violence and pain, but in the midst, in secret places, there was hope, there was fruit. But fruit that may not have been expected, fruit of justice, fruit of mercy and these were appearing in unlikely places. Fruit that was coming from hearing and welcoming the word of God. This in a time of great stress, a land in great need, a land in a time of foreign domination.

We all at this time long for those favourable surroundings, but the hint is that we will not have them, at least not yet. And when, at a time when we do appear to have them, we should not be lulled into thinking we have them forever, but that they may be only for the purposes of God at that moment. Yes, the old world still remains. We still live in troubled times, the kingdom of God hasn't been fulfilled yet and we haven't yet arrived at home in the eternal freedom, the eternal peace, the eternal security.

But for now, let us listen to his word, and let that seed grow within us, let it grow within us, let it take root, deep and secure. For we know that our surroundings are hard, so we need deep roots of faith to contend with the pressures of our world. So may God grow deeply within us this day and every day. Amen

St Aidan's Church is to reopen for the first opportunity to worship together in church since mid-March **on Sunday 12**th **July.**

In line with government guidance, anyone with symptoms of Covid-19 or from a household where there is someone self-isolating or have been requested by NHS Test and Trace to self-isolate, should not enter the building. The church has been thoroughly cleaned and will be cleaned between openings.

Here is a summary of the measures in place to ensure that the church is a Covid-safe venue so that you know what to expect when you come to church:

At the Manchester Road/South Door	Please wait at the door for a Sidesperson at a safe distance (2m) from each other. Please understand that it may be necessary to turn you away if we have reached the maximum capacity.		
When you enter church	Please observe 2m social distancing. Please use the hand sanitation station. Please stand still to have your temperature checked.		
Seating	You will be escorted to your seat following the one-way system. Household groups should sit together and there must be no moving around. Please remain seated throughout the service Please fill in your details on the track and trace card* on your seat with the pencil provided and leave both on your chair when you leave. Please complete one card per household group with all your names.		
Service	The service will be a short, said Ante Holy Communion. The congregation will not be offered bread and wine. There will be no singing and no service sheet. Do not stand for the Gospel or Creed – remain seated at all times. We will not be able to share the Peace. The sermon will be printed in the newsletter and available online. If you do not have internet access, please speak to a Sidesperson.		
When you leave church by the West Door	Please leave any offertory envelopes on the plate by the West door when you leave. Please do not congregate inside church – please speak to friends outside at a safe distance. Please note that there will be no access to the Hall so toilet facilities will not be available.		

*In order to support the NHS Test and Trace programme, we are taking contact details for all visitors to St Aidan's Church. In line with government guidance, we will keep your details safely and in compliance with GDPR legislation for 21 days before securely disposing of them. We will only share your details with NHS Test and Trace, if asked, in case it is needed to help stop the spread of Coronavirus. We will not use your details for any other purposes or pass them on to anyone else. Thank you for your understanding. If you agree to providing this information, please write the following on the card provided: names of persons attending from your household/social bubble; telephone number; signature & date.

A full risk assessment has been carried out by the Vicar and Churchwardens.





