From the Vicarage: a reflection for the Sixth Sunday after Trinity

We are children of God, we are Sons and Daughters of God, we can Cry out Abba father, Dad be with us.

Whenever Jesus prayed he called out to God as Father. There was only one exception when Christ was on the cross and he cried out "My God my God, why have you forsaken me ", but that was a quote from the Book of Psalms. Otherwise I believe it is 18 times in all the gospels that he calls God Father. And in Mark's Gospel he calls God Abba father, an intimate way of speaking to God in the same way that a child would call out to their Dad. We are reminded that this would have been shocking to the Jews, as they would never, even today, talk to God in those intimate terms.

So the relationship of Jesus and God is as close as a parent to a child.

Jesus also said, no one knows the Father except the Son, and anyone to whom the Son chooses to reveal him.

God loves you and me, said Jesus, as passionate as the father in the prodigal son story. Forever loving his child, forever forgiving us, for ever running up the street to meet us and great us and bring us safety home. God rejoices, God is excited, God is ecstatic, when we call out in prayer to him as our father.

We are reminded that in Matthews's gospel when two or more believers meet to pray they should say, "Our Father in Heaven"

And St Luke says simply that when we are alone, and call upon God, we simply say, "Our father, Hallowed, be your name".

So we are called, not to grand prayers, not to great acts to get God's attention when we need him, but to simply grow in that same intimacy that Jesus had with God, and simply say to God, My Dad.

May the blessing of God the + Father the Son and the Holy Spirit be upon you this day and forever more. Amen
