St Aidan's Church Children's Groups



Kindergarten 3-7 years & Adventurers 7-14 years

We meet in church during school term-time at 10am for the beginning of the service – the children go out to the Hall with the Children's Leaders during the second (Gradual) hymn and return for Communion. All Leaders have undertaken DBS checks and training. Parents/Carers may accompany children for a settling-in period but we expect them to apply to be Leaders and undergo the necessary checks if they wish to do this for an extended period. Having new leaders helps us to get to know the children better and introduce new ideas to our sessions as well as to work with smaller groups.

Church

Your ongoing financial support is crucial to the upkeep of St Aidan's Church. Our recent calculations showed that £17 per person per week is the amount we need for the upkeep of the Church and the payment of our "share" to the Diocese, part of which ensures that we have a Vicar and contributes to the pensions of retired clergy. This amount is certainly not possible for all church members but we do need to be aware of the difficult financial situation of the church when considering our giving and supporting fundraising efforts. Giving by the envelope scheme and standing order are vital ways of supporting our church.
