One Bible teacher writes "I read an Interesting book by an unbeliever who attempted to 'do in' the Christian Faith .

Despite his lack of belief, I found insightful something he said regarding prayer.

He called it 'the most incredible conceit in the history of humankind' arguing that if you worked for the Ford Motor Company as a lowly employee and wanted to see the boss you wouldn't have the remotest chance"

Think about it. What would happen if a UK citizen tried to speak to the Prime Minister? I've thought about putting in a person to person call just to see if it could be done. And what would happen? I would probably get to speak to an under under under secretary of an assistant somebody, but no way the Prime Minister.

"And so" says my sceptical friend, "what an incredible conceit to suppose that at any moment we can talk to the boss of the whole shebang"

And indeed the concept of prayer would be incredible conceit if it weren't true.
